Message from Reverend Father Krikor A. Sabounjian

Pastor of the Armenian Church of the Holy Translators

Dear Friends of the Armenian Church of the Holy Translators,

In my message for the Church's Consecration 20 years ago, I wrote the following:

Our story began around a dinner table while enjoying some fine wine. **And it all began with a question**: "How can we provide for our children the same experience that we had growing up as Armenian Christian Young People, which provided the foundation from which we now live our lives and the friendships, which have lasted for more than 30 years?

<u>That question was transformed into a vision:</u> The vision to create a community in the MetroWest Area in which families could gather together to build the same kinds of relationships that we were blessed to have under the umbrella of the Armenian Church.

And that vision was transformed into the Armenian Church of MetroWest. In 1997 a small dedicated group of visionaries, not knowing where it would lead, but placing their faith in God and their destiny in our Lord and the Holy Spirit, began a faith community we all knew and loved: the Armenian Church of MetroWest. And this community has flourished and exceeded all of our expectations.

The vision was transformed into a reality where Faith, Family and Fellowship truly meet. Our community is more than a community. It is more than a Parish. It is a family. We do not have functions. We have family gatherings. This is due primarily to the fact that each and every Sunday we all gather together as one family, adults and children together, and we pray together and we gather around the table of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the head of our family. And we receive His blessed Body and Blood, which bind us all as one family.

Now our Church building has been consecrated and transformed into a home dedicated to the Glory of God. We too, must be transformed into a loving Armenian Christian Community, always striving to do God's will every day. We must not view the Consecration as a completion of a mission. Rather, we need to see it as an opportunity to grow to even greater things. It is a beginning of our new life dedicated to the will of God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Now, 20 years later, we have a different name: The Armenian Church of the Holy Translators; some different faces – some have left us, others have joined. The color of our hair may have changed, but our vision remains steadfast. We continue to strive to bring the treasures and faith of the Armenian Church to all who enter our doors in ways that are more participatory and meet the needs of the variety of demographics, while maintaining the integrity of our ancient Holy Tradition. We continue to be a family oriented, warm and welcoming family.

Although, compared to our sister Churches, we are still a young Parish, we have made our mark within the Diocese and throughout the Armenian Community world-wide. God has truly blessed us.

As we begin yet another new chapter in our relatively young life, may God grant us the wisdom to know His will and the courage to fulfill it as we strive to make the Armenian Church significant in the life of every Armenian and his or her family.

HISTORY OF THE HOLY TRANSLATORS



Vision and humble faith led to the creation of the Armenian alphabet for no greater purpose than to preserve the Holy Scriptures for a nation that embraced Christianity as a way of life. Such is the power of letters that has preserved a nation and its identity until today despite facing persecution and hardship.

The Feast of the Holy Translators (*Tarkmanchadz*) is dedicated to a group of notable saints and literary figures who have contributed to Armenian literature.

Nearly two hundred disciples of St Mesrob Mashtots and St Sahag are known by the general group name "Holy Translators." Celebrating the feast, the Armenian Apostolic Church specifically pays tribute to: Sahag the Parthian, Mesrob Mashdots, Yeghishé, Movses the Grammarian, David the Invincible, Gregory of Nareg and Nersess of Hromgla.

It is thanks to the Holy Translators that the Holy Bible was translated into Armenian, allowing Armenians to read the Holy Book in their native language. The first words written in the Armenian language were from the Book of Proverbs: "To know wisdom and instruction; to perceive the words of understanding" (Proverbs 1:2). They also opened schools to teach the newly-discovered alphabet. This led to a spiritual-cultural awakening in Armenia through the work of the Holy Translators.
